39 PHILADELPHIA SPECIAL OLYMPICS ATHLETES HEAD TO VILLANOVA FOR 27TH ANNUAL FALL FESTIVAL. NOV. 6TH – 8TH

(Philadelphia, PA, November 2, 2015) – Special Olympics Pennsylvania's (SOPA) Fall Festival will return to Villanova University for the 27th consecutive year from November 6-8, 2015. In celebration of Fall Festival's 27th anniversary, Villanova's campus, located at 800 E. Lancaster Avenue, will be transformed to an Underwater theme and features Opening Ceremonies with live entertainment, Healthy Athletes® programs, an "Olympic Town" festival offering athlete activities between sporting events, a Victory Dance and Closing Ceremonies.

On Friday, November 6th, 39 Philadelphia Special Olympics athletes will head to Villanova for preliminary competition in bocce and soccer, beginning at 1:00pm. That evening, athletes from across Pennsylvania will head to The Pavilion for Opening Ceremonies, which officially kicks off the weekend festivities. The anticipated Opening will feature the lighting of the Olympic Torch to signify the official start of the games.

Philadelphia's 39 athletes consist of 8 traditional bocce team athletes, 4 unified bocce team (2 partners and 2 athletes), a 7-a-side soccer team consisting of 11 athletes, a 5-a-side soccer team consisting of 10 athletes, 4 individual soccer skills athletes, and 2 individual volleyball skills athletes, and 11 coaches to Fall Fest.
